# Collaborative Effort Delivers \$13 Million in Critical Medical Aid to Sudan Amid Ongoing Violence

Washington, DC – (12 October 2023) – In response to the escalating violence in Sudan, Project HOPE, Airlink and key partners, including MAP International, Flexport.org, Astral Aviation, and Qatar Airways, have successfully coordinated the delivery of \$13 million (24,000 pounds) worth of vital medical supplies, pharmaceuticals, hygiene supplies, and therapeutic food to Sudan. The Sudanese American Physicians Association (SAPA) and Project HOPE will oversee the distribution of the shipment, ensuring that hospitals and health facilities facing the most critical shortages receive the supplies necessary to continue their vital work in treating patients.

The shipment includes essential medical supplies, ranging from syringes, gauze, and wound care items to medications, including antibiotics, antiparasitics, and pain relievers. Additionally, it includes prenatal vitamins, oral rehydration tablets, hygiene supplies, and protective equipment. Recognizing the exacerbated food insecurity across the entire Horn of Africa due to prolonged drought, the shipment also incorporates therapeutic food. The shipment will support over 100,000 people across Sudan where communities are grappling with under-resourced health facilities and cholera and dengue outbreaks.

"This shipment is a lifeline for many hospitals that are lacking the supplies and resources to address the influx of patients seeking care and lifesaving medication for everything from cholera to gunshot wounds to pregnancy," said Arlan Fuller, Director of Emergency Preparedness and Response for Project HOPE. "This partnership exemplifies the essence of humanitarianism — nonprofits and corporations coming together to share resources and knowledge to reach those who need support the most."

"Airlink's partners have struggled to get needed medical aid into Sudan since the conflict broke out in April, owing to the limited flight options and high cost of airlift into Port Sudan - the country's only operating airport. We are proud to say, we've found a way to get aid there," said Steve Smith, Airlink President & CEO. "By bringing together our donors and partners in the private sector - Astral Aviation, Flexport.org, and Qatar Airways Cargo - and coordinating this shipment with long-time nonprofit partner Project HOPE, we've been able to make the impossible possible in the midst of one of the most challenging humanitarian crises facing the world. We hope this is just the start of our work in Sudan, breaking down the logistical barriers to get aid where it is needed most."

"MAP International's participation in this collaborative effort to deliver \$13 million in critical medical aid to Sudan underscores our commitment to making a meaningful impact on global health crises. In times of escalating violence and dire need, it is imperative that organizations and partners unite to provide essential medical supplies, pharmaceuticals, and support to vulnerable communitie," said Steve Stirling, President and CEO, MAP International.
